Designate a space for backpacks that is out of your pets' reach.










Craft projects like homemade playdough and slime can be fun to make, but are harmful to pets if eaten.

How can you tell if your dog is happy? Pets use body language to tell us how they are feeling. A happy pup might have a fast wagging tail and a wiggly body. But a slow tail wag can indicate a dog is feeling uncomfortable. A dog who is relaxed may have an open mouth and ears that are loose and not pulled back flat.

Some dogs may even show you they want to play by performing a play bow (when front legs are on the ground and their bottom and tail are in the air).


PET SPOTLIGHT
