WARM WEATHER TIPS



Paws can be sensitive to extreme heat. Take your dog to grassy areas for walks and playtime.

Dogs can overheat quickly in the summer heat. Exercise should be limited to early morning or late afternoon.



While outside, make sure there are plenty of shady places your pet can go to cool down.



Pets should never be left inside a vehicle. The temperature inside of a car can increase rapidly.



PUPSICLE RECIPE

Keep your pup cool this summer with a fun frozen treat.

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup non-fat plain yogurt
- 1/2 cup blueberries
- Medium bowl
- Ice cube tray or freezer-safe cup



Recipe:

1. Ask an adult to help you.
2. Mash the blueberries in a medium-sized bowl.
3. Add 1/2 cup of non-fat plain yogurt into the blueberries. Mix until combined.
4. Spoon the mixture in to the ice cube tray and place in the freezer for about 2 hours or until frozen.
5. Let your pup enjoy this cool summer treat.

Reminder: Treats are yummy, but they should only be given to pets occasionally.

4. Visit CHS to drop off your donation or mail in your earnings. If you raise \$50, you get a free lemonade t-shirt!

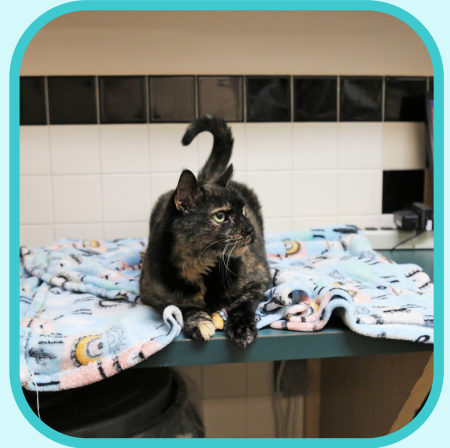
